**Workshop Details:**

Explore the art of pottery in this 2-hour introductory workshop led by our trained Pottery Instructor. Participants will learn hand-building techniques and create their very own pottery piece! No experience required.

**Dress Code:**

Please ensure that you are dressed for clay activities. Clay does wash out of clothing, but is very messy so a smock/apron or an extra t-shirt is recommended. Refrain from wearing jewelry and keep long hair tied back.

**Food and Drink:**

Please note that food should not be consumed during the workshop. We ask that any drinks are kept in a lidded container.

**Pottery Pick-Up:**

Pottery will be ready for pick up 4 weeks following the workshop. You will receive an email regarding the drop off date.

Participants in our pottery programming acknowledge there may be minor variances in size, shape or color in their final pieces due to the nature of the ceramic process. Such variations are inherent in the making of handmade and hand

painted ceramics, so you may expect minor distinctions that will make your pieces special and truly one of a kind.

Even though our technicians and staff make every effort to ensure that pieces made and left in our studio for firing are successful, results may vary. From time to time, pieces may be lost, cracked, broken, or damaged due to various factors. Even experienced professionals lose pieces due to improper use of techniques (too thick, too thin, too fragile, too much/too little glaze), and other issues that cannot be prevented.
